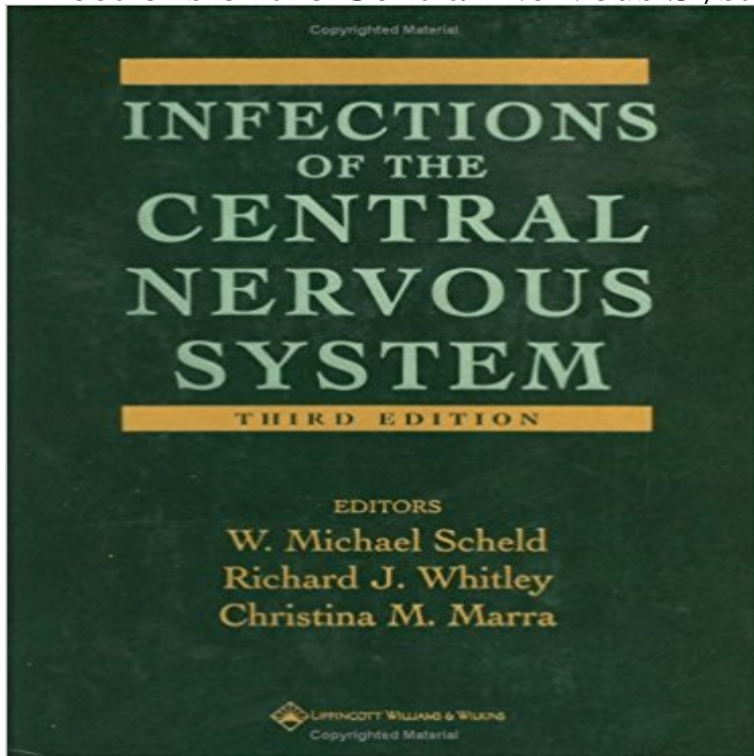


Infections of the Central Nervous System
