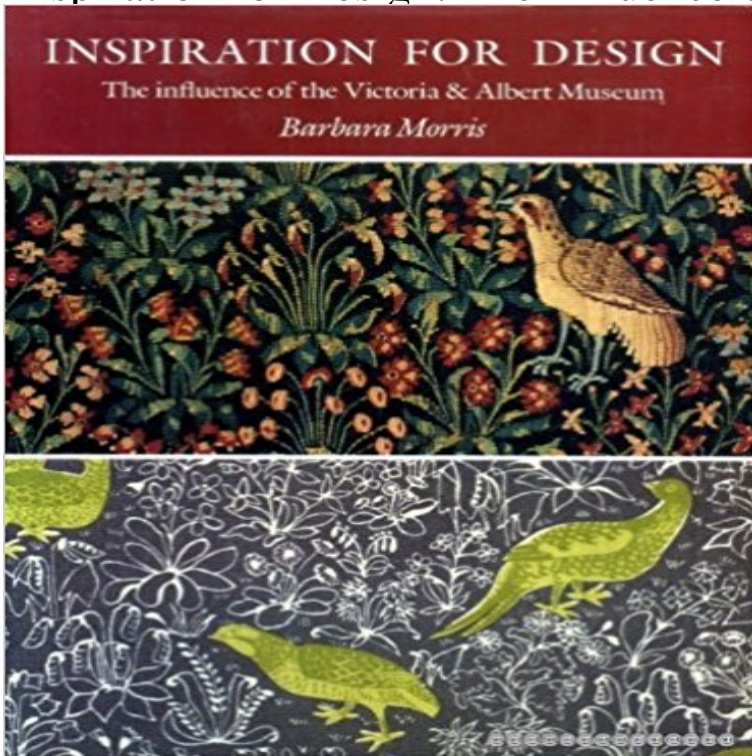


Inspiration for Design: The Influence of the Victoria and Albert Museum
